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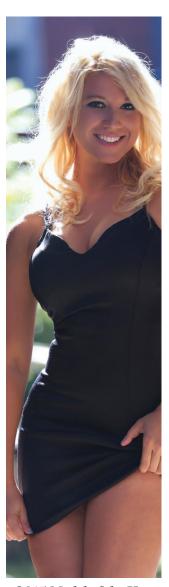

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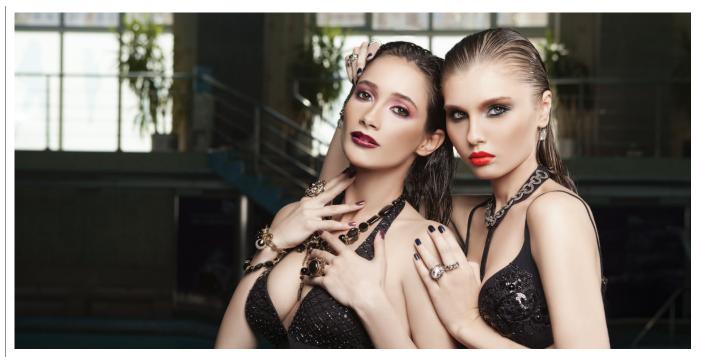

Amphibian Extinction Looming?

cientists have long been concerned over the number of animal species going extinct in recent decades and new data suggests that it is amphibians which are bearing the brunt of what is being called a sixth mass extinction. A certain amount of vanishing species is a natural part of the world's process of maintaining equilibrium but recently released figures from a number of sources suggest that amphibians are losing species at a rate over 200 per cent greater than the expected value.

Save the Frogs, a California-based conservation organization, claims that currently nearly one third of frog populations are under threat of extinction, with around 200 species having disappeared since 1980, a huge difference over their usual rate of one species going extinct once every 500 years.

Furthermore, another conservation effort, NZFrog, notes that although this decline is not a new phenomenon, with scientists having observed it for some time now, the main concern is that is becoming too late to stop such disastrous extinctions. NZFrog claims that 32 per cent of all amphibians are facing extinction and given the group's importance in the food web, their complete eradication would have drastic ramifications for both the predators which rely on them and their prey species. For example, the loss of such an important carnivore at the top of the food chain could cause dramatic increases in malaria-carrying mosquitoes while other already rare species which prey on amphibians, such as the western terrestrial garter snake, are likely to become even rarer should they lose their main source of

nourishment.

Data on such declines has been collected for some time now, with The Telegraph observing as far back as 2008 that more than 50 percent of Europe's amphibians could be expected to disappear by 2050, and with noted naturalist Sir David Attenborough concerned at the effects of the loss of what he called the 'lifeblood' of the environment. While many may not realise how important a role amphibians play in the balance of life, Sir Attenborough is not understating things when he says that such a loss is both 'extraordinary' and 'terrifying'.

A number of causes behind this dramatic decline have been identified, with Save the Frogs highlighting a multitude of environmental problems facing amphibian populations, including pollution; disease; invasive species; habitat loss; climate change and even harvesting for the pet trade. One particular threat which has been responsible for a number of extinctions in Australia, the Caribbean, and North, South and Central America is the infectious disease Chytridiomycosis. First identified in 1998, the disease has been found on over 250 species of amphibians in 36 countries and has been linked to over 100 extinctions since the 1970s.

One school of thought suggests that amphibians are becoming more susceptible to the disease due to an increase in environmental pollutants which reduce the ability of their immune systems to protect them. The problem thus becomes more complex, with a number of factors which must be considered if amphibians are to be protected. The most alarming question though is, is it too late to save this vital group of animals, or are they destined to go the way of the dinosaurs?

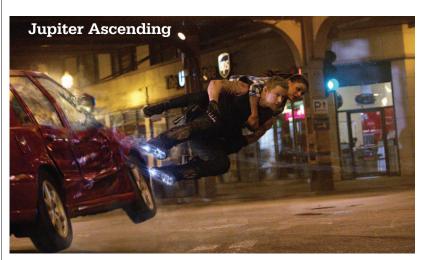

DELICIOUS DISHES

NEW RECIPES FOR 2015

he New Year heralds new beginnings. If you're quite the kitchen buff but is running out of new recipes to serve to family and friends, we've rounded some new delectable dishes – from the main course, dips to pastas – that will star and rock your dining table this year.

Cheese-Studded Mac and Cheese Ingredients:

1 cup shredded white cheddar cheese 3/4 cup shredded Pecorino cheese 2 slices finely chopped American cheese

- 1 cup shredded Gruyere cheese
- 2 ounces chunked Camembert Cheese
- 8 ounces elbow pasta
- 2 cups whole milk
- 3 tbsp all-purpose flour
- 1/4 cup unsalted butter
- 1/4 tsp cayenne powder
- 1/4 cup bread crumbs
- 1/4 tsp paprika

Salt

Black pepper

Procedure:

Pre-heat an oven rack at the oven's top half. Meanwhile, boil salted water in a large pot. Pour the pack of macaroni into boiling water and let cook for five

minutes. Remove the pot from fire just before macaroni turns al dente. Strain and set the macaroni aside.

Take out a cast iron skillet and place over medium heat and heat butter until it melts. Sprinkle all-purpose flour and whisk until the mixture becomes paste-like in consistency. Whisk the mixture until it becomes golden brown, then slowly pour the milk over. Whisk vigorously for around 8 minutes, making sure there are clumps within the mixture. Continue mixing until the mixture resembles a heavy-cream mixture and add in the paprika and cayenne pepper. Season the sauce with salt and pepper to taste.

Mix 1/4 cup of mixed pecorino, cheddar and gruyere cheese and set aside. Slowly add the remaining cheese into the mixture, whisk and make sure that there are no clumps. Continue mixing in low heat until all cheeses are melted.

Coat the macaroni with cheese and fold properly. Sprinkle the macaroni with the cheese you've set aside previously, followed by bread crumbs. Broil the skillet of mac and cheese for 5 minutes or until the cheese turns golden brown. Serve while hot.

Mini Sweet Potato Pizzas

Ingredients:

Sweet potato, peeled into ribbons (use an ordinary vegetable peeler to achieve this)
Pizza crust or 4 pcs naan bread

1/2 clove garlic
Chopped kale
red onion, shaved
brussel sprouts, shaved
pecorino cheese, grated
ricotta cheese
red chile flakes
olive oil

Procedure:

First, pre-heat your oven to 325 degrees. In a wide plate, sprinkle the sweet potato ribbons with salt and a drizzle of olive oil. Take a pizza crust or naan bread and scrub the surface with sliced garlic. Sprinkle the surface of the crust or bread with some ricotta cheese then top with sliced onions. kale, Brussels sprouts and a few ribbons of sweet potato. Top the whole crust with grated pecorino cheese. Do the same for the rest of the crusts or breads. Place them in the pre-heated oven and bake for 20-25 minutes or until the sweet potatoes have been cooked through. Serve as main dish or appetizer along with your preferred refreshments.



Chicken, Kale and Pear Stew Ingredients:

12 ounces cut up cooked chicken and apple sausage, cut up

1 can of 15 ounce rinsed and drained cannellini (white kidney) beans

2 cored and sliced pears, cored and sliced

1/2 ounce can chicken broth ½ cup wedged onion medium onion, cut into thin wedges (1/2 cup)

1 tbsp. olive oil

2 cloves minced garlic

½ cup chopped kale

2 tablespoons cider vinegar

1 tablespoon Dijon-style mustard

Procedure:

Take a large skillet and heat oil over medium heat. Add the pears, sausage and onion wedges. Let these cook for around 8 minutes or until the sausages and pears appear brown then remove and set aside.

Cook the garlic and beans in the same skillet. Stir in the mustard and broth and bring to a boil.

Once the mixture boils, reduce the heat and let boil uncovered for around 4 minutes. Allow the liquid to be reduced in half then add kale, letting the mixture cook for another 10 minutes with occasional stirring. Add the cooked sausages and pears, cider vinegar and let it heat through for another minute.

Creamy Avocado Pasta

Ingredients:

6 ounces whole wheat spaghetti pasta

1 tablespoon fresh lime juice

1 large ripe pitted and peeled Avocado

6 tomatoes

1/4 cup chopped fresh cilantro

1/2 teaspoon kosher salt

1 clove minced garlic

Ground black pepper

Procedure:

Take a medium pot, pour water and bring to a boil over medium heat. Add some salt and the pasta into the pot, then reduce the heat and let the pasta cook until it becomes al dente. While the pasta cooks, get a food processor and place the avocado, cilantro, lime juice and garlic. Season with salt and pepper to taste. Blend all the ingredients until the mixture appears creamy

and smooth. Drain the cooked pasta and place in a huge bowl. Take the sauce from the food processer and toss into the pasta until everything is well coated. Add your tomatoes with salt and pepper if desired. This dish is best serve on the same day it was prepared.

Mixed Honey, Peanut Butter and Yogurt Dip

Ingredients:

16 oz plain Greek Yogurt

3 tsp honey

3 tbsp peanut butter

Procedure:

Mix all three ingredients together in small bowl and blend until the mixture becomes smooth and creamy. Serve with sliced fruit, crackers or cookies.

Orange-Ginger Salmon

Ingredients:

2 pcs 4 oz. filleted salmon

1 tsp avocado oil

1 tsp honey

1/2 orange, zest and juice

1/2 tsp sweet paprika

1 tsp grated ginger

Salt and pepper

Procedure:

Whisk together avocado oil, ginger and honey and coat each side of the salmon with this mixture. Place the salmon into baking dish lined with parchment with the flesh side-up. Season the top of the salmon with salt, pepper and orange zest. Let the salmon sit to marinate for 10 minutes. Bake afterwards in a preheated oven for 12-14 minutes or until the salmon is cooked and easily flakes with a fork. Serve with hash potatoes or mixed vegetables on the side.

WHAT EVERY GYM-GOER SHOULD HAVE IN THEIR GYM BAG

or most, getting to the gym isn't as simple as throwing on yoga pants and hopping in your car. Instead, it takes planning ahead to be fully prepared. A number of people head to the gym before or after a full work day, which means plenty of packing the night before. Although you can't pack your meals in your gym bag ahead of time, there are a number of items you can always have waiting for you in your bag, so you never find yourself in an un-showered, shoeless, or silent predicament.

I usually recommend you start with the basics of what you'll specifically need for your 1-2 hour workout, and then add extra according to your goals and schedule.

1. Good training shoes are essential. Whether it's lifting, running, or spinning, the shoes absolutely matter. Arriving to the gym without any shoes is going to put quite the damper on your training session, especially since most gyms (understandably) don't allow you on the gym floor without the proper foot wear. It doesn't hurt to have a couple extra pairs. Keep your favorite pair in your gym bag that you use daily, but store a second pair in your car, or even in a locker at the club, if they allow overnight locker rentals. I've had many clients miss out on a great session after leaving their shoes

at home or work!

2. Headphones and IPODs are important to most people nowadays. There are a few that don't mind the music they play over the speakers at the gym, but for the majority of us, our own music at our own volume is essential to a good pump. Training is a place where





you can focus on just one thing, relax your mind, and have a little you-time. Listening to your favorite kind of music, can help amp up your session and keep you motivated! Always keep your headphones and music player in your gym bag, so you're never stranded in silence.

3. Water is so important when you're lifting heavy or working hard on cardio. Staying hydrated is essential all day, every day, but in particular when you are at the gym. I usually recommend

keeping a few extra bottles of water in your gym bag in case you find yourself without any available! Whether it's water or some other healthy type of hydrating liquids, having access to plenty of fluids is essential. So save yourself some money and carefully pack your own.

4. Supplements are also good to store in your everyday gym bag if you use them. Depending on your goals, you may use pre-workouts, BCAAs, Whey, etc. Typically, when I meal prep for my week, I also divide out my supplements into containers and place them in my gym bag. This way, I never have to worry about feeling unprepared.

5. Training accessories can be key in certain exercises, and should always be packed and ready to go. These could include lifting gloves, wrist or lifting straps, knee or elbow sleeves, and deadlifting socks. Sometimes, it may also include equipment your gym doesn't carry, such as glider discs or resistance bands. It is better to over pack and have what you need, than to wish you had something you chose not to bring.

6. Your training plan may not be something you actually have in hand, but it's good to always have it available. Some people don't go to the gym with a plan in mind, but others have their weeks planned out far in advance. Programs may be available on your cell phone, but if you're like me, you keep a journal of your lifts to always track your progress. I always make sure my lifting log is in the bag at the beginning of the week!

7. A towel, or two, is going to be very important for anyone heading out after their session. You may want a small towel on the floor to wipe up sweat,



as well as a bigger towel to shower afterwards. If you're heading to work after your workout, make sure you have shower essentials with you, as well as anything you may need to prepare for your day. A separate toiletries bag kept inside your gym bag with all that you like to have with you for your clean up session is a great idea.

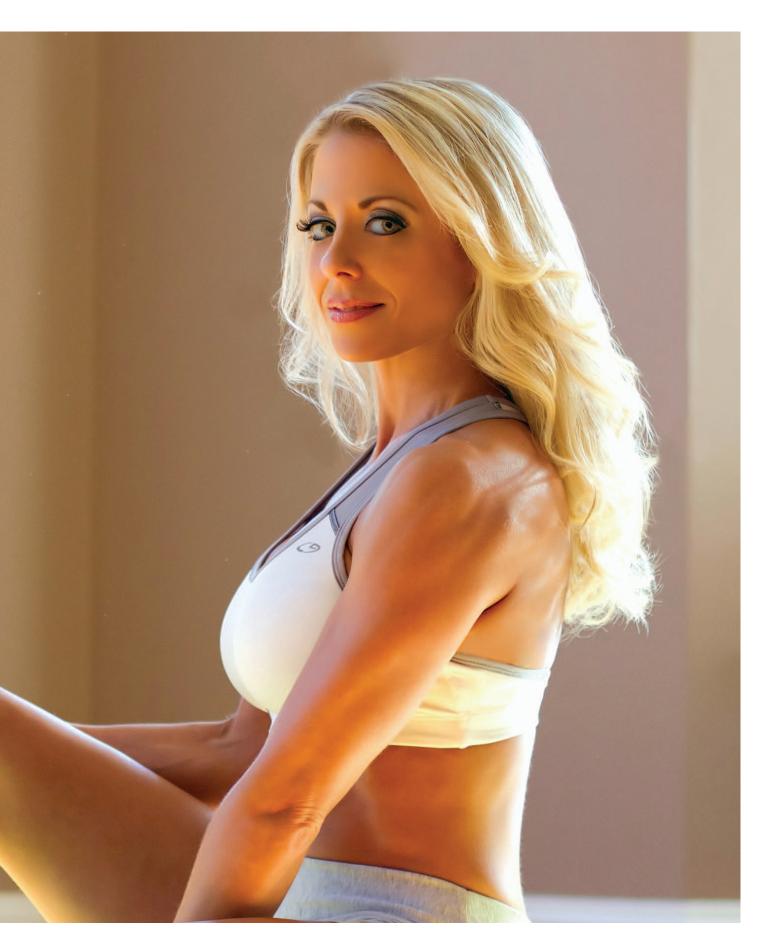
8. These last suggestions are not something you can physically pack, but they should be there whenever you open your bag-motivation, determination, focus, and excitement. Sometimes I feel too tired to go to the gym, or too busy to find the time. However, I keep my gym bag with me as a reminder of what's important to me. When I open my bag to prepare myself, I usually begin to feel more motivated. Seeing my lifting straps, my music, and my headphones is the first step in turning around my mind! So whether you plan on a gym day or not, I suggest you always have your gym bag with you; you never know when a burst of motivation will hit!













Kelly, it is very clear you take your fitness seriously. Do you feel pressure to look perfect? What are your sources of motivation to stay in shape and be healthy?

As an NPC bikini competitor, once you get to a certain point in your conditioning, there's no going back. It's always about getting better. For me, the "pressure to look perfect" is my own vision of perfect. I am not looking to fit anybody else's standards but my own. Everybody has a different version of what they think "perfect" is to them. As long as I constantly push myself to improve, I am happy. Feeling comfortable in your own skin is important. To help me stay motivated, I try to surround myself with extraordinary people who want the same thing. My social media friends are made up in a large part of fitness athletes, personal trainers, nutritionists, models, entrepreneurs, etc. Reading their posts and seeing their photos daily keep me fired up. Another motivation is keeping my physique looking lean and muscular like it is. I know the only way to have that is to work hard every day at it. When I get to the gym, my music is a huge part of keeping the fire going. Choose music that can put you in a "zone". Focus is important when training. Don't let yourself get distracted. Put all you have into it and push your limits. Knowing that I did better than my last workout or went heavier keeps me motivated to challenge myself each and every workout. You feel amazing and accomplished after every workout and I crave that feeling even when I feel a bit lazy and don't feel like training. Dedication is doing it even when you may not feel so motivated that day. The only bad workout is the one that didn't happen.

Take us through what your "typical gym routine" would be? How typical is it? How often do you switch things up? Why?

For me I have two types of training. #1. Off-season training is a bit different from training before a competition. Training is a bit more "old school" if you will. In my off-season, my goal is to add more calories to my diet and lift heavier with fewer repetitions (at least 6) in order to build more lean muscle. My cardio is tapered off from when I am competing as well. I will train legs two times a week, but incorporate different exercises each time. One day will be chest, shoulders, and triceps, and one day will be back and biceps. Two of the days will just be cardio, and I take one day (usually Sunday) off. Abs are incorporated into three of these workouts. I will do as many exercises as I can until the muscles are fatigued. Every couple of months I switch up my workouts so that the muscles respond better. They will get used to the same exercises after a few months and you will not see any changes. Each workout with weights will last about an hour and then 1/2 hour of cardio. My cardio consists of a variety between the elliptical, the stair climber, the treadmill, and the bike. Intervals are the best so that your body doesn't get used to the same pace. It is good to raise your heart rate for about a minute and then lower it. You will burn more fat this way. Intervals can be done with any cardio. Since glutes are a huge part of being a bikini competitor, I will do donkey kicks and squeeze the glutes on every step when doing the stair climber. #2. Competition training differs in a few ways. First, my diet is a lot stricter and I consume less calories. It will differ for everyone depending on their goals and activity level. In this phase, I am trying to hold on to the lean muscle I've built during off-season but shred fat as well. Training consists of pretty heavy weight but I need to get 3 or more sets of at least10 reps out of them. It's more about fine tuning each part of each muscle. I work with a trainer about once a week or once





every other week when prepping for a show. I still train legs two times a week and train the other body parts as listed above. My cardio is increased to 6 days a week at 1/2 hour a session. In all my weight sessions, I superset or rest-pause drop set. Super-setting means performing two different exercises for the same muscle group in succession, without rest in between. Doing a rest-pause drop set means doing a set to failure at one weight, stripping a percentage of the weight and repping to failure again, and repeating this process until you are satisfied or can't do anymore.

Everyone has to miss a workout every now and then. How do you deal with missing a workout and what reasons will you skip?

The only reason I will ever miss a workout is if I'm really too ill to train. If I happen to have injured myself, I will train other body parts. It will take a lot for me not to go to the gym. I always take Sunday's off so I make it a point to work out the rest of the week. Things do happen and I will try to fit my workout in wherever I can, whether it's first thing in the morning before work, on my lunch break, or after work.

When working out, even though it's good to switch things up, what is

the one thing you NEVER leave out in your routine and why?

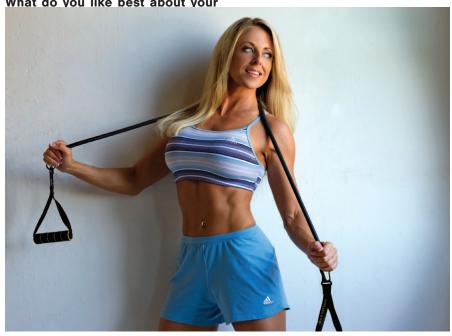
physique? Why? What do you like least and want to improve?

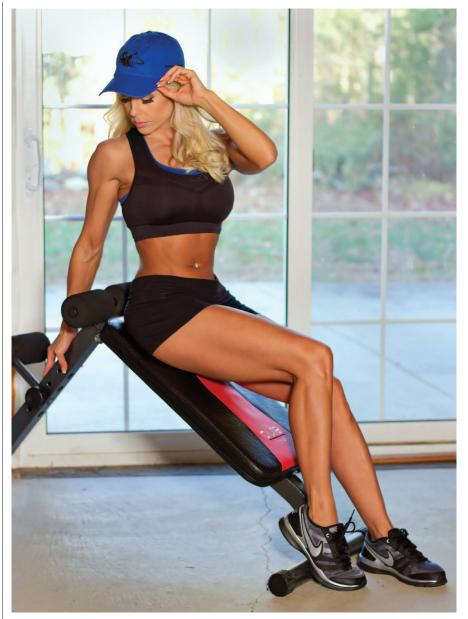
Here are some tips to manage stress:

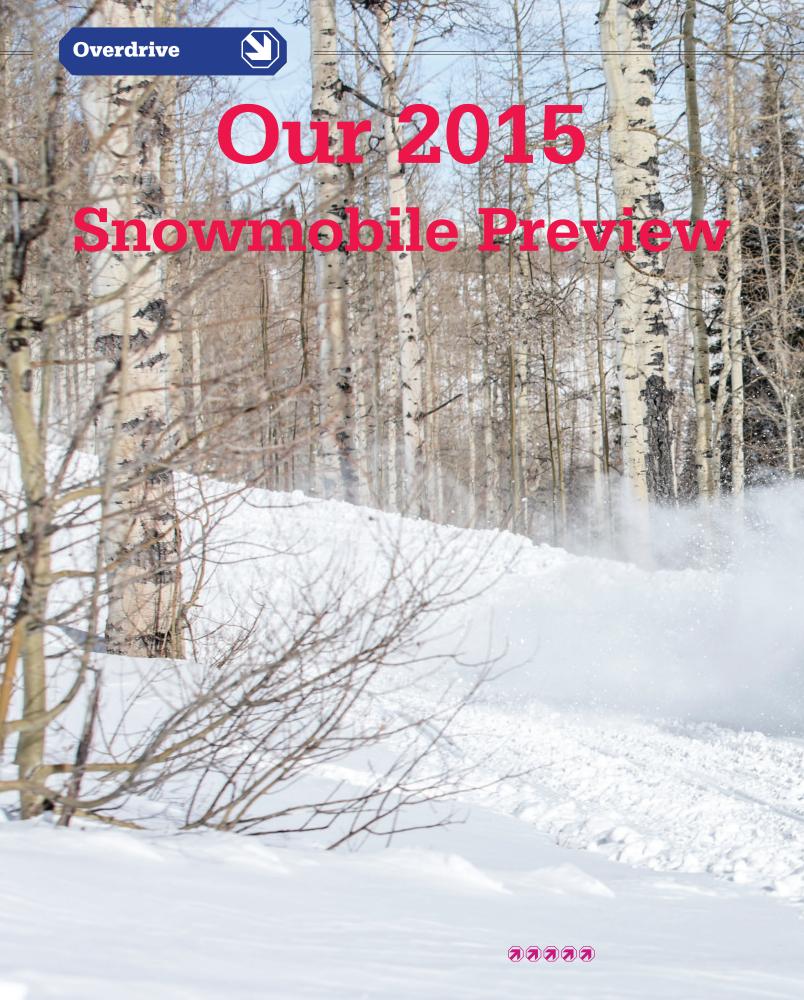

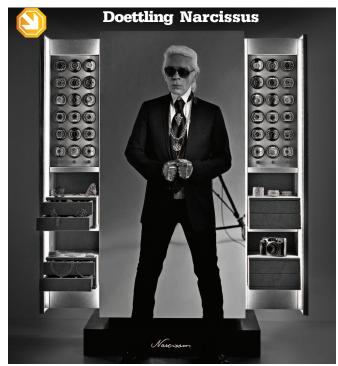

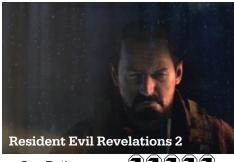

2015 VIDEO GAME PREVIEW

hile 2014 has seen its fair share of superb titles across a variety of platforms, from the likes of blockbusters such as Dark Souls II, Dragon Age: Inquisition, Far Cry 4 and Titanfall, 2015 looks set to be the year when the new-gen consoles truly come into their own. Here we take a look at some of the most exciting games that are scheduled to be released over the next twelve months.

January

One of the first potential hits out of the gate in 2015 will be Dying Light, a survival horror game for Xbox One, PS4 and Windows from Techland and Warner Bros. that mixes zombies and parkour to highly intriguing effect. The game is set in a post apocalyptic future deep in the slums of South America where that perennial favourite of science fiction writers, the zombie virus, has overrun the world and turned much of the population into mindless, slavering monsters. Players must explore a vast open-world, engaging in bloody, visceral combat with the infected and scavenging for supplies as they traverse the chaos-ridden city.

What sets Dying Light apart is its thrilling movement system, with players able to leap around rooftops, bounce off walls and make use of the environment in whatever cunning fashion they desire to wreak havoc amongst the bloodthirsty hordes. There is also a wide range of weapons and gear that can be used in equally inventive ways, allowing players to tailor the game to their own personal play-style, be it aggressive with lots of in-your-face combat as you sever limbs with wild abandon, or more subtle and strategic as you lure zombies into explosive traps while you hide in the shadows. It's this sense of freedom and open-endedness which is perhaps most exciting and players will get the chance to experience the nightmare for themselves at the end of the month.

February

February looks to be a highly competitive month, with several potential block-busters slated for release. Evolve takes the beast slaying action of Monster Hunter and turns it into a competitive shooter, where teams of four tooled-up mercenaries stalk vicious creatures

across an alien world. Of course, the twist here is that the monster is also controlled by a human player, with this asymmetric play-style offering a radical change over the usual team-based shooters. The hunters have access to some serious weaponry to help them out, such as harpoon guns and orbital barrages but don't have things all their own way, with several monsters available for selection, each of which have abilities such as fiery breath, lightning strikes and powerful leaping attacks. The planet itself is also a threat, with carnivorous plants and packs of aggressive beasts roaming around, and the hunter team must really work together if they are to bring down the monster, utilising their tracking and slaving skills if they are to emerge victorious. For a neat twist on the usual deathmatch-style shooter. Evolve is definitely one to watch.

February also sees the release of the much delayed The Order: 1886, an alternate history action adventure from Ready at Dawn, developers of the PSP versions of God of War. Set in the murky streets of a steampunkstyle London, players take on the role of an honourable knight who is part of a mysterious order at the forefront of a centuries-old war between humans and half-breed monsters and which now threatens to tear the world apart. The game features an impressive array of bizarre high-tech weaponry, such



as the Arc and Thermite guns, and crafts a compelling, rich and immersive narrative set in a wonderfully realised alternate past. For lovers of the likes of character-driven action games such as Uncharted and Tomb Raider, The Order looks set to deliver the goods.

Fantasy fans are in for a treat in February as the long awaited third instalment in the epic Witcher saga is finally released. The gameplay is similar to previous games in the series, with a familiar mix of exploration, combat and questing, but the open-world setting is more expansive than ever before, and it is claimed to be 20% bigger than Elder Scrolls: Skyrim. Even more exciting is the way that every player action affects the world around them, with multiple options to complete each quest, ensuring the game feels truly alive and evolving, while several inventive new mechanics are also thrown into the mix, including horseback combat and the intriguingly named 'witcher sense'.

March

Another game which has been subject

to delay is Battlefield: Hardline but it should finally be released in March. Developed by Visceral Games, who produced the acclaimed Dead Space series, the game aims to break away slightly from the usual Battlefield formula by placing the emphasis on law enforcement and criminals rather than the established military theme. The single-player campaign (a much maligned feature of previous Battlefield games) is promised to be non-linear. with a branching storyline that allows for player choice, but it's the multiplayer aspect which most gamers are likely to be interested in. Here, they can expect a plethora of new cops 'n' robbers related game modes, such as Hotwire, where high speed chases are the order of the day, and Rescue, where the cops must save hostages being held by the crims. The usual impressive arsenal of weaponry is supplemented by the likes of tasers and handcuffs, while Levolution, the environment changing mechanic that rips holes in the landscape also returns but one has to hope that the game is

not plagued by the same kind of issues that Battlefield 4 suffered from.

April

One of the most enduring franchises in gaming history returns in April, with the release of Mortal Kombat X, the tenth instalment in the notoriously gory one-on-one fighting series. Old favourites like Sub-Zero and Scorpion return in a non-linear storyline alongside new characters including Cassie Cage, daughter of Johnny Cage and Sonya Blade; D'Vorah, an insect-like woman with the ability to control bugs; and Kotal Khan, an Aztec-style blood god. It's tough to see where the developers can go next in terms of grossing out players, but fans can expect an even more outrageous set of brutal actions and fatalities, with Scorpion's face-slicing perhaps the most incredibly disturbing finishing move in the series' history.

May

May sees the release of what promises to be a remarkable 21st century update of a classic 1980s game. Developed by Julian Gollop, the industry legend best known for creating the X-Com franchise, Chaos Reborn is a sequel to his own turn-based tactical role-playing masterpiece from 1985, Chaos: The Battle of Wizards. The original is an acknowledged multi-player classic and sees players taking on the role of duelling wizards who seek to bring down their foes with an array of powerful spells. This new sequel maintains the original's basic premise but updates it extensively by adding an RPG mode and plenty of fashionable social aspects like the ability to join guilds, trade with other players and develop characters. While Chaos was understandably crude, if charming, in its graphics, this reboot is a visual feast, with designs that echo the originals but which take advantage of modern technology in stylish and elegant fashion. Gameplay too is noticeably improved, with added depth provided by the extensive spells and creatures on offer and mechanics such as the ability to cast illusions on your foes. Whether you have fond memories of the 1980s or are just looking for a deep, rich fantasy experience, then Chaos Reborn looks set to provide hours of enjoyable strategy and action.

June

June's big release is the final instalment in the critically acclaimed Batman franchise, with Rocksteady Studios back at the helm after Warner Bros. Montreal took over for Batman: Arkham Origins. Following on directly from Arkham City, the game sees Kevin Conroy returning as the voice of Batman, and pits him once more against the terrifying powers of the twisted Scarecrow. Gameplay promises to be an enhanced version of the much loved mix of exploration, puzzle solving and free-flowing bone-crunching combat that have made the previous games so popular, with new mechanics and gadgets thrown into the mix. Perhaps the biggest, and most exciting, addition is that of the Batmobile, with players finally able to get behind the wheel and bring terror to Batman's enemies. Packing Vulcan guns for taking out individuals, a 60mm hypervelocity gun for wrecking vehicles, and even a riot-suppressor for when a non-lethal approach is required, the Batmobile is definitely a force to be reckoned with. A who's who of DC villains also makes an appearance, including Penguin, Two-Face and Riddler but a major question mark hangs over the identity of the titular Arkham Knight, an all-new villain created specifically for the game by Rocksteady in conjunction with DC artists and writers.

Rest of the year or unconfirmed

Gaming schedules are extremely difficult to maintain so nailing down firm release dates can be tricky but the latter part of 2015 looks set to host some superb titles, even if it is impossible to state with certainty when exactly they will be released.

Microsoft's top exclusive, Halo, returns at some point in the year, with Halo 5: Guardians down for a third or fourth guarter release. Now in the hands of 343 Industries after original developers Bungie split from Microsoft, the game looks set to continue the high standard set down by previous instalments in the landmark science fiction shooter series. Details are scarce at the moment, although portions of the multiplayer mode have been seen thanks to the beta testing which took place this year, but a teaser trailer suggests a continuation of Halo 4's storyline, with old characters returning alongside new enemies. Interested parties should check out the Halo: Nightfall tie-in, a live-action digital series produced by Ridley Scott which introduces the narrative and which is available as part of the Master Chief Collection.

The gaming legend that is Snake returns in 2015 with the release of Metal Gear Solid V: The Phantom Pain, the true open world Metal Gear game that fans have been waiting for since the cruel tease that was Ground Zeroes. Following on directly from that game, The Phantom Pain sees Snake traversing a massive world, seeking revenge on figures from his past before uncovering a new threat to world peace. There's the usual mix of stealth, action and overblown plotlines, backed up by stunningly realistic graphics, beautiful design work and of course the dulcet

tones of Kiefer Sutherland as Snake.

No Man's Sky is an impressively ambitious open-world science fiction game from British studio Hello Games, where players get to venture into the stars, exploring, trading and fighting their way through a procedurally generated universe, in similar fashion to classics like Elite. Players are free to travel as they wish, taking jobs on the wrong side of the law or exploring uncharted worlds and laying claim to them. Online features will allow players to interact with other bold adventurers, trading, battling or teaming up in the name of science as they see fit and although it's early days yet, the game has already won numerous awards for its bold and innovative take on the genre.

Another industry star that is getting an outing in 2015 is Lara Croft, with Rise of the Tomb Raider following up 2013's impressive reboot of the franchise. Details are as yet thin on the ground, but a trailer doing the rounds promises all the gritty, globe-trotting action we know and love, while hopes are also high for the story, given that the game is being written by Rhianna Pratchett, who worked on the highly regarded previous instalment.

2015 will be a big year for blockbuster action franchises, as Lara's chief rival also returns in the form of Nathan Drake as he stars in Uncharted 4: A Thief's End. The game finds a retired Drake returning to the fray as he sets out to uncover a vast conspiracy behind a legendary pirate treasure. Little has been seen of the game as yet, beyond a teaser trailer that offers plenty of clues and red herrings for those keen to seek out the truth, but Naughty Dog have promised that this will be Drake's greatest adventure yet, testing both him and gamers to the fullest. With the directors of the stunning The Last of Us, Neil Druckmann and Bruce Staley, now onboard, this does not seem like an idle declaration.

So, that's just a few of the highlights we can expect from 2015, with the promise of others such as Star Wars: Battlefront, a new Legend of Zelda game, Bloodborne and Projects CARS also getting gamers the world over excited about the coming year. While some might inevitably not quite live up to expectations, there's no real doubt that we are living in exciting times and that gamers have never had it so good.

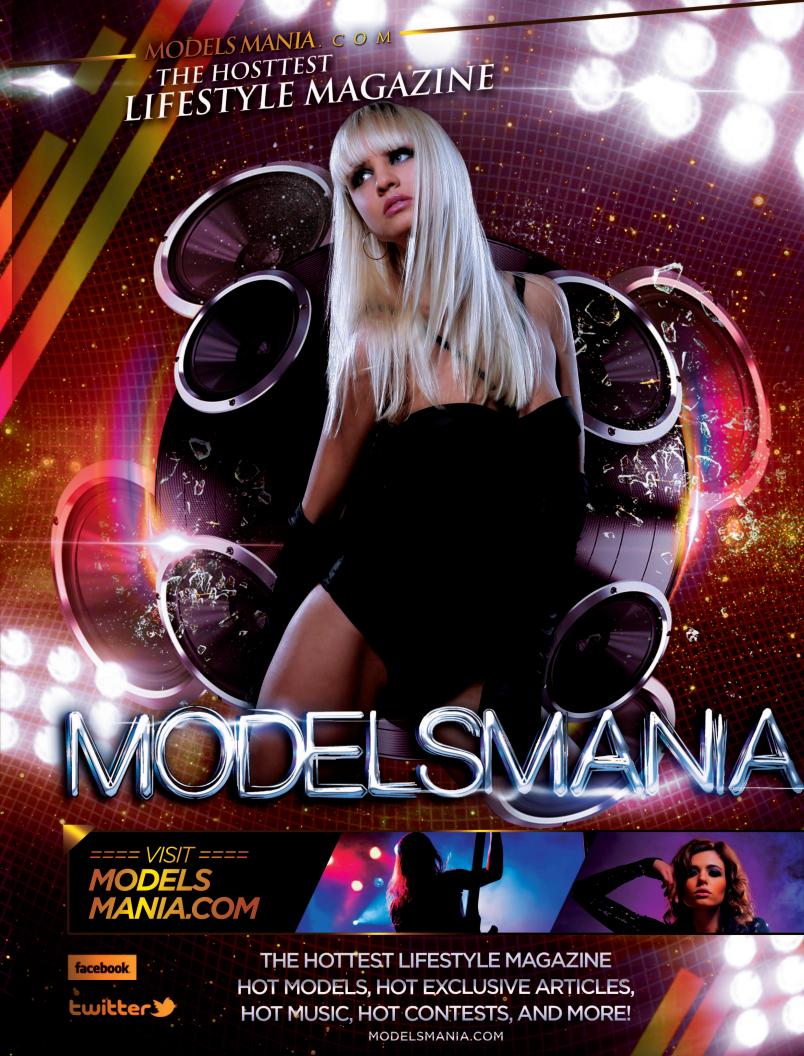

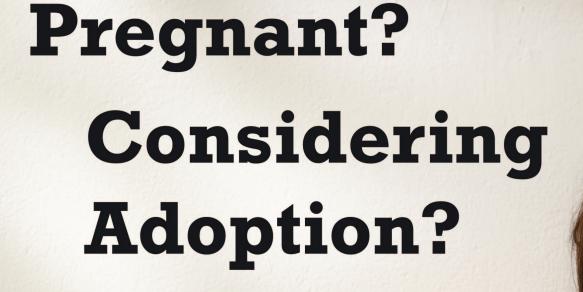


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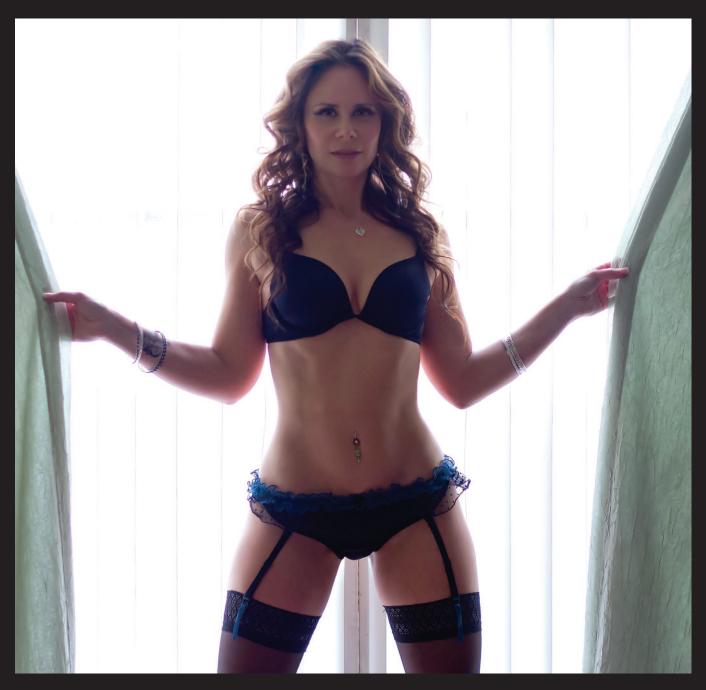

HOW ZOMBIES WORMED THEIR WAY TO THE MODERN CULTURE

ften depicted as mindless corpses that seek out living flesh for their consumption and survival, zombies have infiltrated the 21st century pop culture. Zombies are associated as creatures with decaying flesh, sometimes randomly protruding bones and oozing blood controlled by a master: a virus, sorcery or dark magic. But what is most interesting about this folkloric character is how they have been romanticized in media depictions - from literary novels, video games to films, and the reactions of the modern man with the living dead.

Origins of Zombie

Before we go any deeper on the effects of the zombies to the modern culture, it is helpful to get further insights on the origins of zombie and its evolution to the present times. The most common story of the origin of zombie is one that is told in the Haitian culture. In the book Voodoo in Haiti by Alfred Metraux, the zombie (spelled zombie) in the book is described as person whose death has been recorded. The dead person's burial was witnessed by friends and family, but is found several years later to be alive and controlled by a sorcerer called bokur.

From the Haitian folklore, the zombie has already been pictured as a living dead without his own willpower and bids the commands of his master. This zombie did not attack humans or eat flesh (yet), but it was depicted as a slow-moving living dead. The common people in Haiti met their ultimate fear with the zombi: it was not to

be eaten by a zombie but to become one. So in efforts to stop possible zombification of the dead, Wade Devis went to Haiti to further investigate the phenomena. In his 1985 book Serpent and the Rainbow, he outlined that the bokur possibly used poison to rouse the dead from the grave but there were several antidotes to prevent this like sewing the corpse mouth or laying him face down to earth in order to disable him from answering the sorcerer's call.

Consuming Zombies in Our Daily Media

It is interesting to note that zombies have inched their way from their Haitian origin into our homes in the forms of popular consumable media: video games, films and literature. Perhaps the first depiction of zombies in films was in 1932 in the filmWhite Zombie by Victor Halperin. Much like the zombie in the Haitian voodoo, the female living corpse in this movie was not flesh-eating. In fact, the producers refuse to portray zombies as cannibalistic by nature. But much like the bokur or sorcerer in the Haiti folklore, the zombie in this classic film was controlled by some form of hypnosis.

While these zombies spread terror in films, their nature became more violent and gore in the following decades. In the movie I am Legend released in 1954, a post-apocalyptic story of surviving a world-full of zombies in the suburbia. Much like the Haitian folklore, the zombies in these films are friends, family and neighbors who had been infected by some sort of a virus.



But the zombies most of us are familiar with, the flesh-and-brain eating, fast-moving corpses who go with hordes are popularized by George Romero's Night of the Living Dead. These zombies were lifeless creatures who mindlessly walk around the city. These zombies also tend to become more powerful and frightening when moving with a mob.

George Romero's Night of

the Living Dead set the pace for what the future zombies will look like, more or less. A decade after, George Romero released Dawn of the Living Dead which picked up from the last scenes of the Night of the Living Dead. There was an insatiable appetite for zombies during the 80s as it provided the audience a kind of thrill and terror they don't experience with vampire or ghost movies.

The Dawn of the Living Dead was followed by the Day of the Living Dead and the Return of the Night of the Living Dead.

All throughout these four movies, the zombies were typified as slow-moving, group-loving and flesh-eating corpses. The fast-moving breed of zombies was introduced in the movie 28 Days Later. Still cannibalistic like the older versions, the zombies in this movie annihilated England and a sleeping survivor journeys through the post-apocalypse storyline. The sequel, 28 Weeks Later, was released in 2007.

Zombies in Video Games

Inspired by the zombie characters in the movies, zombies as villains in video games became best-sellers as well. In 1996, the Resident Evil was available in the playstation. Like most post-apocalyptic zombie storylines, the Resident Evil video game featured a leading character annihilating the zombies by shooting them in the brain or cutting their heads off. In 2009, Resident Evil 5 was released, still the same storyline but the zombies looked more modern and aggressive: they can ride motorcycles, drive vehicles and hold weapons and artilleries.

Other video games that featured zombies include Last of Us, House of Dead and World War Z. Plants Vs. Zombies was also a popular game played in more recent technologies like the smartphone and Ipad. The main premise of this game is that gruesomelooking zombies controlled by a higher and more powerful creature destroys the plants and eat the brains at the end of the trail.

Zombies in Music

It has become apparent that our penchant for zombies does not stop in video games and music. Zombies have become a recurring theme in music as well, Thriller by Michael Jackson being the most popular. Coupled with a choreography simulating the movements of the living dead, Thriller has become one of the most popular music of choice during Halloween.

Aside from the zombie message, whether pun-intended or not, in music, some music videos have also included the appearance of zombies. Some examples include "Kick It" by Peaches and Iggy Pop, "Coffee" by Aesop Rock, and "Scream" by The Misfits. Zombies in the music videos pretty much look like and act the way they were previously described, but with an added sensuality in some of these MTVs.

Zombies in Television

From the time White Zombie was shown in theatres in the 1930s to the present, we have been seeing how zombies evolved from one form to another. And the closest and most available exposure to get your zombie-fix nowadays is through television series. AMC's The Walking Dead has been making waves since its pilot episode in 2010. The series revolves around a group of people who survived the zombie apocalypse.

The Walking Dead now runs on its fifth season and continues to hook viewers not just with the dynamics of the characters, but also with the dynamics of the character of the zombies, here called walkers. The walkers in The Walking Dead are presented in the most balanced versions of the old and new zombies: they eat flesh, like to move with groups, but they can also be strong.

The element of drama in this series is also very catching. It presented conflicts between characters because friends and family were turned into walkers. The only way to not turn to be one is to be shot or stabbed in the head, or else the human loses proper judgment and willpower and its only source of sense is to feed on flesh in order to survive.

The Zombie Apocalypse

The zombies have become so embedded in our culture that at one point, we began to examine and analyze the possibility of their existence or contracting a virus that can induce zombie-ism. We've feed on zombies in the digital media for years now and instead of

them feeding on us, we've become very hooked on their persona.

Have you heard about stashing food, water, emergency kits and weapons not just to survive a calamity but survive the possible onslaught of zombies into the world? Have you actually considered "zombie-proofing" your home or constantly think of an exit route should zombies attack anytime soon? However, zombies may have frightened you to dig a tunnel under your house, but you also have to admit that like vampires, we've also come to celebrate the thought of their existence in our modern culture.

The zombie apocalypse just like those in the movies, games and novels opens us to the idea that the world may end with zombies free-roaming about anywhere and humans have to hide or fight back, least their brains be eaten. The zombie apocalypse inspired what's

scary about these beings: rotten flesh, loss of willpower and the carnal desire to eat flesh. On the other hand, the concept also tells us that we celebrate the concept of the existence of zombies. While many of us are not exactly fond of the thought of the dead roaming amongst the living, we also get thrilled with the idea of it.

The zombie apocalypse, or the belief in it, tells us that zombies have made a significant impact in our modern lives. Perhaps without us realizing it, the zombies have actually made us scared about dying, rising from the grave and being one of the slow-moving flesh eating mobs. Whether you are skeptical, frightened or unaffected by the thought of the zombies, it is interesting how zombies have positioned themselves into the popular culture and how we've come to welcome them with mix emotions.

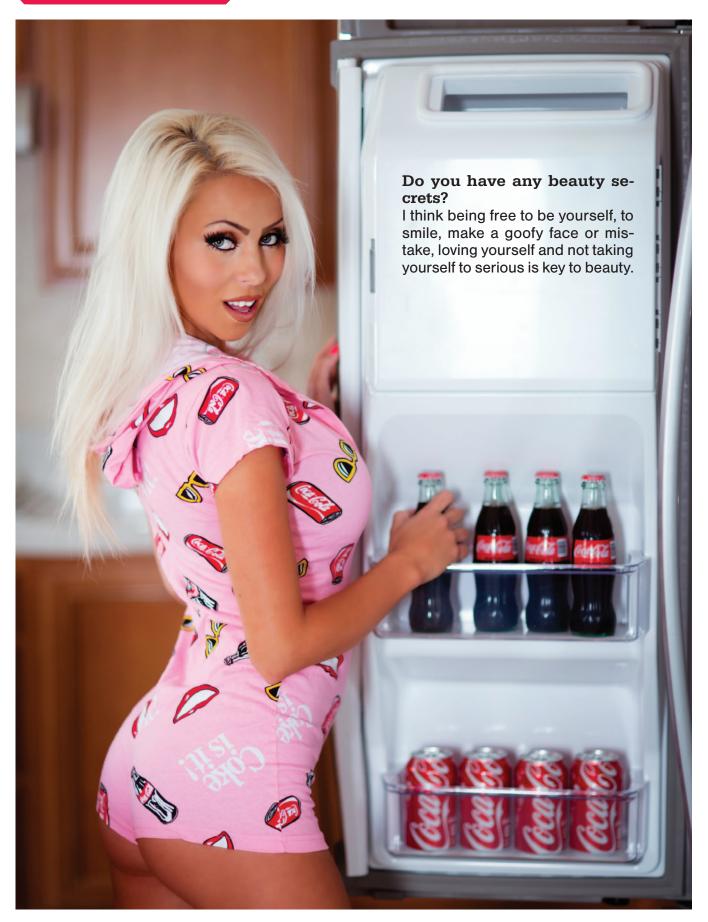














































he next few months promise to be exciting times in the world of comic books, with a number of new titles released alongside plenty of returning heroes and movie and game tie-ins from both the major publishers and the smaller indies. Here, we take a quick look at some of the more intriguing titles coming soon.

Tying in to the forthcoming block-buster video game release that is Batman: Arkham Knight, DC Comics have announced that a digital-first series will be coming in February 2015. The game acts as the concluding chapter to the highly acclaimed franchise and sees the introduction of an all-new character designed specifically for an all-new narrative, with this comic series playing the part of prequel. Story details are still firmly under wraps but the book finds Batman recovering from the shattering events of Arkham City and questioning his role as Gotham's

protector. However, the appearance of the mysterious Arkham Knight brings everything into a new light and it's not long before Batman is back out on the streets.

The comic is being written by Peter J. Tomasi, who has an extensive lineup of credits as both editor and writer, including books featuring the Justice League, Batman and Robin and Green Lantern while art duties are being handled by Viktor Bogdanovic and Art Thibert. The print edition will feature two covers, one featuring art from the game and will go on sale 11 March 2015.

The writer behind one of Spiderman's most controversial storylines ever returns to the series in March for another instalment in the web-slinging superhero's tumultuous timeline. Gerry Conway co-created the classic villains of Tombstone and Hammerhead and also tugged readers' heartstrings with the emotional death of Gwen Stacy and

his comeback to the universe of the Amazing Spiderman promises to live up to his lofty reputation.

The five-part story, entitled Spiral, sees Spidey flipping between the down and dirty grit of New York City and the inter-dimensional world that is the Spider-Verse. Spiral features the relative newcomer character that is police captain Yuri Watanabe, who also happens to moonlight as vigilante Wraith, and sends this honorable and heroic individual down a dark path that sees her facing the central dilemma to her dual life. Spiderman too doesn't miss out on the self-analysis and starts to look at the justice system and his role within it in a whole new light but if this is starting to sound a bit too serious, then don't panic. The whole thing plays out against a backdrop of gang war, with several groups vying for control of New York after Kingpin's unceremonious kicking out and when you throw in both Hammerhead and Tombstone,



Spiral promises to be as action-packed and thought provoking as fans could hope for.

In a slightly bizarre move, the video game series from Telltale Games. The Wolf Among Us, is getting a comic book interpretation, despite having actually originated as a comic book in the first place. The game is set in the Fables universe of Bill Willingham, where various characters from folklore and fairy tales have found refuge in the mean streets of New York and acts as a preguel to his original series. Both the comic book and its spin-off Fairest are coming to an end however, so it seemed only natural to the creatives at DC and Vertigo to cash in on the game's success and explore this fascinating setting even further.

The Wolf Among Us is notably different from the main series and writers Matt Sturges and Dave Justus are keen to explore its dark, noir-like world where murder and mystery are never far away. They promise to venture into main character Bigby's backstory through flashbacks while also maintaining the poetic horror elements that have helped make the game so popular. The first episode is available now and fans of either the game or the original series would be well advised to check it out, thanks to its mix of stunningly atmospheric art and what promises to be an engrossing, convoluted storyline.

Movie fans eager for the return of Star Wars might be able to satiate their desires in early 2015 when Marvel publishes several new series starring the original heroes of the classic films. The first ongoing series is set between the events of A New Hope (Episode IV) and The Empire Strikes Back (Episode V) and features such iconic characters as Luke Skywalker, Han Solo and Princess Leia battling to save the universe in the way that only they know how. Although the Death Star may have been destroyed, dark times still lie ahead for the Rebel Alliance and Darth Vader intends to turn his apparent defeat into victory for the Empire.

Vader also gets his own series in February which promises to tell the tale of the epic battle for control of the galaxy from the dark side and follows his quest to return to the position of the universe's most feared individual and to restore his reputation in the eyes of his master, The Emperor. Finally, Princess Leia gets the chance to shine in a five-part series that deals with her coming to terms with the loss of her home planet and the responsibility which comes with being a rebel leader.

Fans of long-running manga series Naruto, the massively successful series that has spawned movies, games, novels and even a trading card series. will be overjoyed to hear that the second sequel will be published in spring 2015, albeit as a shorter mini-series. Although the exact extent of the story is as yet unknown, it has been reported that the series will focus on the children of Naruto, Hinata, Sakura and others and takes place after the epic finale of the current series, which came to an end in November 2014. Fortunately for fans, the new series will still be in the hands of creator Masashi Kishimoto, so hopes are high that whatever surprises he has in store will live up to what has gone before.

The long running series that is Archie returns in 2015 ahead of the 75th anniversary of its creation in 2016. Published by Archia, this relaunch is promised to take the series back to its edgier roots, while building off the

humorous strengths of its extensive line-up of characters to create a surprising and definitive take on Archie's origins, a story that has never been told. The re-boot is in the capable hands of Mark Waid and Fiona Staples who between them have worked on acclaimed titles such as The Flash, Kingdom Come, Superman, DV8 and Saga and who have both been recipients of an impressive set of prizes including Eisner, Joe Shuster and Harvey Awards.

For a trip into an imaginative science fiction setting where natural death has been conquered and where nine new self-proclaimed gods struggle for supremacy, then IXTH Generation has to be worth a look. Published by Top Cow Productions and following on from the cybernetic future laid down in Aphrodite IX and Cyber Force while combining it with the supernatural elements of Artifacts, this first episode in the new series presents readers with a startling vision of the future while posing some fascinating and complex questions on the nature of Utopia and the possibility





of its creation. Featuring bold, stylish artwork and a thought-provoking storyline, this one promises to be a series of some interest for comic book fans on the quest for something a little unusual.

A definite treat for followers of Michael Turner's long running Fathom series, which has been thrilling readers for over 15 years with its tales of underwater adventure, is the upcoming release of the Fathom Sourcebook, a detailed and comprehensive look at this fascinating universe. The book drops just in time for Christmas and features plenty of profiles and background info which shed light on story elements, characters and equipment while also featuring heaps of the lush artwork that has helped to keep the series going for so long.

Another series which shows no sign of losing its appeal is Dark Horse's Al-

iens, which has been expanding on the stunning sci-fi universe first established in Ridley Scott's seminal movie and which has seen a number of sequels across movies, books and comics. The current series, Fire and Stone, sees its fourth episode released at Christmas time and continues to bridge the gap between Prometheus, the most recent film to tackle the scariest xenomorph in the galaxy, and Aliens, James Cameron's gung-ho follow-up to Scott's original. This episode continues the tale of survivors from Hadley's Hope as they escape one nightmare only to find themselves caught up in another, with the Alien not far behind. Written by Chris Roberson, Fire and Stone is subdued and moody, exhilarating and horrific in equal measure and should be checked out by followers of one of the richest franchises in movie history.

If you've been lamenting the lack of classic Chaos! Comics character Chastity, then you'll be pleased to hear that she returns in March 2015 in a 176-page trade paperback. Reimagined for a new audience, the all American teenager finds herself recovering from an athletic injury and taking refuge in a series of vampire novels. However, unbeknownst to Chastity, these books act as a portal into a world of vampires, pain and hatred and she soon finds herself facing the ultimate darkness as she grapples with the possibility of an unholy change into a blood-sucking being... or something worse. If you like your comics darkly humorous with lashings of action and violence, then this is another re-boot which should be high on your list on New Year's reads.

Although the idea of a comic book based on a Disney theme park ride sounds weird, Marvel's upcoming Big Thunder Mountain Railroad actually looks highly promising and follows in the footsteps of the equally enthralling Seekers of the Weird and Figment. This one combines the talents of old-hand Dennis Hopeless (Avengers Undercover) and rising star Tigh Walker to create a thrill-packed origin story for the legendary Disney ride and explains how it became the haunted attraction

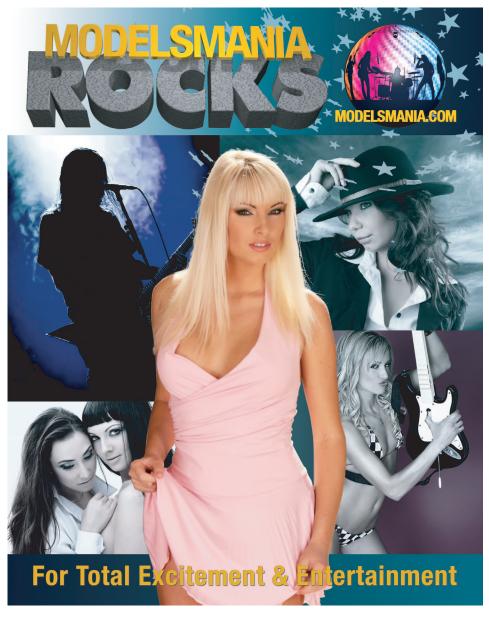
it is today. The first issue of this five part story hits the streets in March and promises all sorts of excitement including earthquakes, floods and even dynamite-munching goats.

A couple of classic movie series are slated to return in 2015 with both Bill and Ted and Howard the Duck making appearances of the shelves of comic book stores everywhere. Howard the Duck may not be the most obvious choice for a series but following his triumphant appearance at the end of Guardians of the Galaxy, it seems there are more fans out there than many imagined. Although many will remember Howard from his terrible 1980s movie, his original comics are

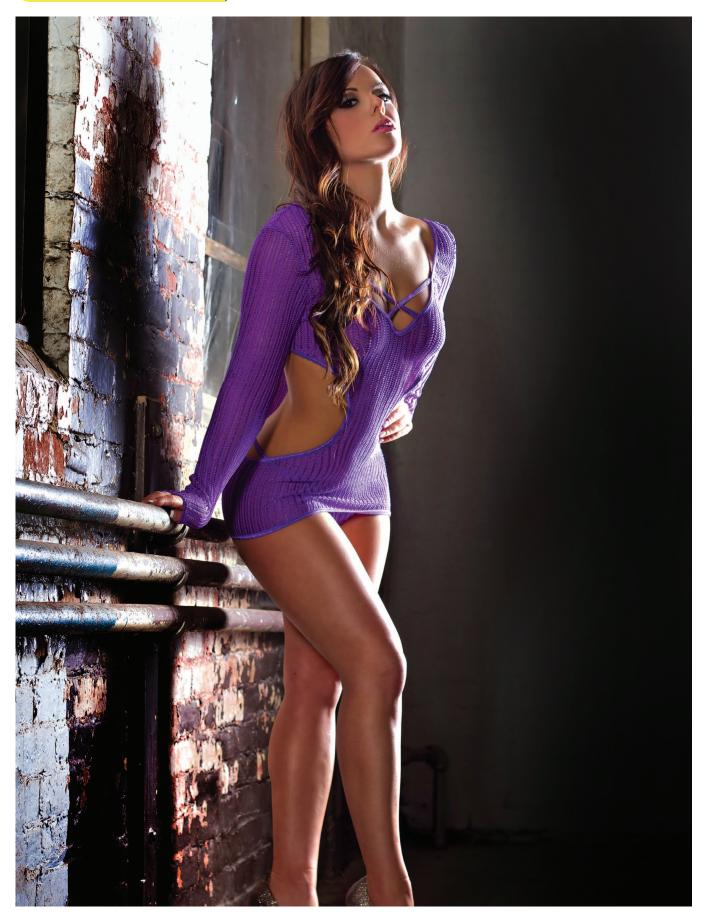
witty and inventive satires running through a variety of genres. The new version has been promised to return Howard to his former glory and will see him working as a private investigator within the Marvel universe, a setting which suggests lots of potential for all-star cameos. The focus will very much be on science fiction and comedy, with a lot of visual gags that hearken back to the originals and which should bring in both new audiences and die-hard fans.

BOOM! Studios will be responsible for bringing back the classic pairing of Bill and Ted, who starred in two cult comedy movies in the 1980s and 1990s and will be seen in 2015 in a six issue miniseries entitled Bill and Ted's Most Triumphant Return. It is apparently unrelated to a potential third movie and is instead set after Bogus Journey, where the duo will travel to the future in order to prevent a young DeNomolos from becoming the villain of that movie. For anyone who loves that retro 80s vibe and slacker humour, this promises to be a nostalgic trip that is most worthy of taking.

So there you have it, a short but sweet rundown of some of the most interesting comics coming out in the New Year and whether your tastes run to science-fiction, horror, superheroes or manga, there's clearly no shortage of books that will keep you reading for the next twelve months.









THE SHINY NEW TOY SYNDROME

he gleaming, glorious Matchbox Race Car beckons to him from the display case sitting up high on the counter, like an altar where beauty is enshrined. The little boy presses closer, trying to merge his being with the space where his desire awaits. His face is glowing with anticipation and inside his chest, his heart beats like drum as the moment edges closer. His mother asks "Is that the one," pointing to the car he wants with all his soul. Unable to speak, his throat so closed with emotion, he can only nod. A soft smile forms on his mother's face and she gestures to the store clerk. He knows what is expected of him. A pristine Matchbox Race Car in an equally pristine box is extracted reverently from behind the display case and is carefully placed into a bag. After a mundane exchange of monies, the prize is bestowed upon the little boy with all the ceremony of a sacred ritual. He beams more brilliantly than the sun, the joy of his life held tightly in his eager hands.

All during the ride home, the little boy thinks of endless and sundry ways he will play with his Shiny New Toy and upon his arrival, he sets to it with fervent energy. The afternoon is a whirlwind of exciting and delightful schemes where he arrays his Toy in encounter after encounter, tableau after tableau, each more wonderful than the last. A radiant sun in a lapis sky stabs down and makes the chrome on the Tov's body sparkle as magnificently as any diamond, the rich tones of the paint blaze with a lustrous beauty that only he can truly appreciate, as he plays with his Toy in a manner that blends love and possessive bliss in equal measure.

His mother's call to dinner brings the afternoon of pure delight to an end, the sun dipping to the horizon and shades of evening creeping out of the corners of the backyard and crawling across the lawn to the house. Once inside, the boy places the Toy on the Newell Stand next to the staircase leading to the second floor and he goes to wash up. At dinner, the little boy waxes eloquent to his Mother and Father about his afternoon with his Shiny New Toy.

They listen indulgently, gentle smirks on their faces, for they have heard this animated litany before. Dinner ends, evening TV shows beckon to the boy and for a couple of hours he loses his reality in Westerns and Science Fiction dramas that he loves with a fierce excitement. Each week there is a new adventure, but each and every week he wishes he didn't have to wait seven days to find out what the next part of the story is going to be. He really doesn't like waiting.

By the end of the evening, the little boy is yawning and his sleepy eyes are closing of their own accord. His mother leads him upstairs, tucks him in and kisses his forehead before heading back downstairs to finish her evening tasks. Before doing anything else that she knows needs her attention, she retrieves the brand new Matchbox Race Car from the Newell Stand and brings it to the little boy's toy box in the den.

It is a large toy box, filled with all the love that money can buy for their cherished little boy. When she opens the toy box, there is a surprising organization to what one would normally assume would be a pigpen of assorted playthings. On the left are a few sports and military toys, but not many. The little boy is too young for such things and has shown fairly limited interest in the run-of-the-mill boys' toys. It is on the right that the bulk of what encompasses the little boy's heart and mind can be seen. A glittering pile of



steel, chrome and paint of surprising size takes up the lion's share of the toy box. Like the heaped treasures of the Incas, a mound of Matchbox Cars spreads its glory. Each car is beautifully made, intricately designed, of marvelous workmanship and every single one of the cars has brought the little boy an afternoon of elation. His mother carefully places the Shiny New Toy at the very top of the pile of cars, hoping that he will remember that it is here waiting for him, but knowing that before lunch tomorrow, his mind will be fixating upon the next Shiny New Toy that will be coming to the Store in another month. There will be other bright things to catch his attention in the days and weeks to come. And this wonderful little toy, so beloved for a priceless moment in time, will be forgotten like all the rest, never to be valued in quite the same way ever again.

I knew several little boys like that growing up, coddled little regents of suburban royalty whose lives were one endless parade of materialistic emptiness, day after day, year after year. And what is even more fascinating is that I see little boys like this even more commonly now in the photographymodeling community and they suffer from the same malady, but apply it to "their avocation" when dealing with female models. It is one of the most serious issues in our Industry today, just another outgrowth of "the girl-hunting" phenomenon and another rotten fruit of the TF/Tests epidemic that continues to cripple an Industry that struggles to be taken seriously and rise to the occasion.

The Shiny New Toy Syndrome is a childish response to an all-too-common need in most photographers to compete with other photographers, giving in to infantile urges and showing little or no willingness to practice the impulse control typical

of adults. Each and every year, there is a new lovely model that finds her way into the stream of social media and for whatever reasons of mixed beauty, presence and sensuality, she garners a fair amount of attention. And soon afterwards, photographers of all talent levels and experience rush to tempt her to shoot with them. For some of those photographers, who are so very eager to jump on the bandwagon and get in on the new "Flavor of the Month", it is a question of "wanting to be first", which is a leftover childishness from the earliest years of school. Every child needed to be first in the lunch line or the first in line coming off the playground, even though there was little or no value in being first. All that mattered was the competitive need to be at the head of the line. And that same behavior continues to exert itself in the psyche of the photographer who hastens to the feeding frenzy, hoping to be first in line to shoot with the Shiny New Toy. Other photographers have

an even more juvenile and primitive motivation for rushing to shoot with the hot new "Flavor of the Month". If they

can produce the sexiest, or most eyecatching of images, they can put "the smackdown" on other photographers and feel the thrill of the alpha male dog that urinates on the log marking the pack's territory before any of the other canines. So rush they do, offering all manner of TF shoots to the new beauty, playing upon her ego and making her feel beautiful and ever-so flattered to be noticed. And what ensues is a torrent of images of the "Flavor of the Month" girl on social media, not one of which will actually be used for any reason like publication, commercial advertising or any legitimate business purpose. They will just be pictures. And the photographer will puff out his chest in triumph that he shot with the "Flavor of the Month" Hottie. And the girl will feel a heady swirl of excitement from all the attention she received from all quarters. And all will seem well. But

> like any condition, the Shiny New Toy Syndrome has an end result worth contemplating.

> Next year, when the newest version of the "Flavor of the Month" beauty comes along, last year's Shiny New Toy will be absent from view. She will be like the Matchbox Car, beautiful and wonderful, but forgotten, because she is no longer new and therefore not nearly as shiny and bright. Sometimes, the forgotten shiny new toy who was once the "Flavor of the Month" soldiers on and tries to build a serious modeling career by legitimate means. And once in a while that girl rises above the girl-hunting little boys and makes a name for herself. But too often, the girl who was once the "Flavor of the Month" and everyone's beloved Shiny New Toy drops out of modeling because she was seduced by the siren call of a brief surge of attention from photographers and on social media, not fully understanding that when the 15 minutes of "fame" are

up, you have to really WORK to keep yourself surging ahead in this Industry. And the little boy photographers are averse to serious work. They just want to have their time with the Shiny New Toy.

On the photographers' side of the equation, their reprehensible and irresponsible behavior has done no end of harm. It continues to perpetuate that stereotype that photographers get into fashion and glamor for one disgusting reason only. Certainly it is true that such is often the case, but many of us are enamored of that wonderful admixture of art and business that makes each day worth living. Another regrettable outcome of their self-absorbed choices is perpetuating the unsustainable belief in many aspiring models that all kinds of success can be had for free. But such is a miserable lie. As models ascend the ranks of serious professional photographers, most will not offer free sessions. Real modeling agencies collect a percentage of your work pay if you have signed with them. Professional makeup artists and stylists expect to be paid for their brilliant work. So the untruth that was planted in the minds of aspiring models that "I can make it to the top for free" usually reaches a dead end at some point. And lastly, most smart aspiring models see what they have got themselves into and recoil from the unethical stance of the little boys. Most of these photographers have a "sliding scale for hotness" when it comes to their imagery. Ridiculous euphemisms like "I only shoot tests/tf for agency models" is another way of saying "If you're smoking hot and tickle my fancy, I will give my time away to you, but all the rest I will charge". I know many young ladies who were charged by photographers when their friends were given free sessions, simply because that girl caught the little boy's eye, stirred something in him and he doesn't have any of the requisite selfcontrol to actually say no. So both girls come out of the exchange losing in the end. The girl who didn't get the freebie feels awful about herself, which is not the end product any selfrespecting professional should ever seek, and the girl who got the test session is an accomplice to enabling the Shiny New Toy Syndrome, just like the mother in the introduction fed the ever-mounting selfish needs



of her son.

In any profession, a code of ethics is expected of those who choose to

call themselves professionals. Lawvers, doctors, teachers, scientists all subscribe to some creed that binds them the straight and narrow when it comes to their behavior and thinking. The problem with the arts is that such ethical codes are more on "the honors system". There is no governing body overseeing the actions of artists and it is only public scrutiny and word of mouth that sometimes causes artists like photographers to reign in their behavior at times. I remember reading about Robert E Lee as a young person, and how his mother taught him to revere General George Washington and to practice self-control and self-denial in ALL things. What few people knew at the time was that her dictates on comportment were a response of the young Robert E Lee's father, who had been a spendthrift, a philanderer and eventually abandoned his family. Photographers and models must be willing to think about their choices and make decisions that not only benefit them, but do credit to our Industry, raising it above the levels of the past towards a brighter and better future. Finding the strength to not aid and abet the Shiny New Toy syndrome is a wonderful place for photographers and models to start building that code of ethics.
